VISITORS Axminster Mothers' Union is visiting us on Tuesday 1 June. Their annual outing takes in Sherborne for lunch, and the Brewers' Arms for Tea – and a short introduction to Parish Church and Village at Martinstown.

ST GEORGE'S TIDE Singers and musicians prepared a comprehensive programme of English music. It was a very enjoyable evening revealing the wealth of talent in our community. A retiring collection of over £80 was divided between the Choir and Music Fund and buying flowers for the July Festival. The same afternoon, ringers from all over Dorchester Deanery came to Martinstown to showcase their team-skills ringing the six bells. Nearly forty people of all ages stayed following the competition for Choral Evensong, and afterwards for tea in the Village Hall. The team deemed the best for "striking" was from St Peter's Dorchester and presented with the shield.

ROGATION SUNDAY had been planned many months ahead, but unfortunately clashed with the School's fun-run, duck race, and barbeque. Nonetheless on a chilly morning, nineteen walked from Longlands Farm at Abbas, for the blessing of fields and animals. Some were sponsored for Christian Aid.

Later, in the barn more than forty people celebrated an informal Eucharist using home-baked bread; and then sat down to hot soup, Ploughman's Lunch and a wide range of sweets. The weather did us no favours, and we were well wrapped up! but this was amply made up for by atmosphere and appreciation for the hospitality given by Winterbourne Abbas. £84 profit from the lunch was given to Christian Aid.

Rogationtide helped us engage with those who manage the countryside, with issues around food and drink, and with wider ecological matters.

From The Rectory



I have had interests, instilled as a small boy in private school by a Headmaster who (looking back) was a man amazingly gifted, kind, compassionate and generous. Leslie Daunt was the best of teachers whose personality in engaging with his special subjects – Latin, Current Affairs, History and Christian Faith - left a deep lasting impression and inspiration. His balanced version of British history has left me with a pride in our nation; and in its ability to change, reform, renew, and develop its institutions. In college, a lecturer who lived and breathed the British Constitution kindled a respect for constitutional monarchy borne from the struggles of previous centuries.

Yes, of course, we can point to errors flaws and horrors, and be critical through twenty-first century eyes of people in Power and Church from past generations. However as a commentator recently pointed out we have just had an election of high passion, deep disappointment, constitutional challenge and resolution without a drop of blood spilt. The Sovereign may be unelected, powerless and beyond politics but she remains for many (if not all) an icon of nationhood and sign of unity who “invites” a leader “to form a government”. Where else in the world is there such a delicate relationship of raw power with powerlessness and politeness, without a tank or riot shield in sight. In this century alone we have lived through profound changes; and despite the turbulence, Britain remains a refuge for thousands who in their homeland personal liberty and a free vote are only dreams.

Church of England Prayer-books lead us to pray for the Queen “that under her we may be godly, and quietly governed” latterly that “we may honour all people and seek the common good” Whatever the colour of our politics, Christian people are bound to pray for all in authority, that they may be given wisdom and skill, imagination and energy, understanding and integrity to wisely govern.

The Flower Festival in July involves many people from the Community. Its theme is Water of Life, and based on the alphabet you’ll find huge imagination and resourcefulness in the displays. There is music on Saturday, and a themed Songs of Praise on Sunday. Refreshments will be on hand on all three days. A donation from the profits will be given to a Water Project in Africa. Come and see!

PAROCHIAL CHURCH COUNCIL

The May meeting of the Council responsible for the three Valley Parishes tackled a full agenda of practical issues around repairs, music licences, finance, printing and the magazine. The worship committee gave a detailed report of its work making recommendations which were agreed as best for consistency and avoiding confusion.

- (a) The current use of a number of titles to refer to the main service of Sunday to be reduced to one –“ Parish Eucharist”
- (b) The original six-month experiment with different Sunday timings had been allowed to run for a further year. It was agreed to discontinue and restore consistent times as follows:-

First, third and fourth Sunday

- 09.30 Parish Eucharist/Come and Praise at Winterbourne Abbas
- 11.00 Parish Eucharist at Martinstown. Fourth Sunday all-ages

Second Sunday (no change)

- 08.00 Parish Eucharist at Martinstown
- 09.30 Parish Eucharist at Compton Valence
- 11.00 Parish Eucharist at Winterbourne Steepleton

It was agreed that the changed times would take effect from SEPTEMBER

- (c) It was agreed to find ways of meeting the needs of Steepleton Manor, as for most residents 09.30 on a Sunday morning is too early.
- (d) It was agreed the Fourth Sunday at Martinstown, using a wide range of music, material, and technology, was meeting a need and should be continued.

It was agreed that Fifth Sundays often came at “difficult times” such as Bank Holidays, end of year, half-term etc. These Sundays will therefore have one morning service in the Benefice at 10.00

Festivals would be better occasions to come together as a Benefice and provide opportunities to work together for special events
(This is yet to be discussed with Compton Valence)

SPECIAL DAYS IN JUNE

THE 3rd SUNDAY IS FATHER'S DAY

(An American Invention!)

It all started in 1909 in Washington, USA when a Mrs Dodd was listening to a Mother's Day sermon. She decided to dedicate a day to her father who was a single parent and had raised her and her siblings after her mother died. She chose his birthday, 19th June.

President Richard Nixon established the third Sunday of June as a permanent national observance of Father's Day in 1972. It was not until the late 70's that it started to grow in popularity. It is not officially recognised by the government in the UK. (But that doesn't stop people buying cards!)

21st IS MID SUMMER'S DAY OR IS IT?

Longest day of the year when the most minutes of daylight occur"

"It marks the beginning of summer"

Midsummer can be on 21st, 24th or 25th or a date close to the Summer Solstice on the 23rd June. It may simply refer to the period of time centred upon the Summer Solstice but more often refers to specific European celebrations that accompany the actual solstice, or that take place on 24th June and the preceding evening, related to the birthday of Saint John the Baptist.

European midsummer-related holidays, traditions and celebrations, many of which are pre-Christian in origin and have been Christianised as celebrating the Nativity of St John the Baptist as "Saint John's Day" festivals, are particularly important in Norway, Sweden, Finland and Estonia, but are also found in Ireland, and in England at Stonehenge and Cornwall.

On the eve of Midsummer's Day, many bonfires used to be burnt all over the country. This was in praise of the sun, for the days were going to get shorter and the sun would seem to get weaker. This meant people would light fires to try and strengthen the sun. The celebrations would also include, feasting, singing and maypole dancing.

SPECIAL DAYS IN JULY

4th July - American Independence Day

"The 4th of July, 1776, the Americans appointed a day of fasting and prayer, preparatory to their dedicating their country to God. The Congress being assembled after having declared America independent, they had a crown placed on a Bible. The religious ceremony being ended, they divided the crown into 13 parts, each of the United Provinces taking a part."

Belfast News-Letter

ESTABLISHED 1737
NETT SALES FAR EXCEED THOSE OF ANY OTHER ULSTER MORNING NEWSPAPER

The first newspaper to publish the full text of the American Declaration of Independence on this side of the Atlantic was the Belfast News Letter. Details of the Declaration were carried on a ship which was storm-bound off the coast of Donegal and was berthed for shelter in the port of Londonderry in August 1776. They were taken up to the Belfast offices of the News Letter and published on August 23-27. It was a European scoop for the News Letter (founded in 1737) for King George III in London had not even been acquainted of the news!

14th July Bastille Day In 1789 the French Revolution had started and crowds stormed the Bastille, a prison in Paris and freed the six prisoners (4 forgers & 2 lunatics, (according o my learned son, who wrote to Valley & Valence to correct my original article!). The day is a Public Holiday throughout France with special events and parties wherever one goes!
