# THE VICAR WRITES



Dear Friends

Many of our churches and our school will have recently held a Harvest Thanksgiving or will be doing so shortly. For most of us it is an expression of our gratitude to God for all the good things that he provides for our benefit. Many people have suffered through the effect of our recent weather not least our farmers. It is important, I think, that we support our local farmers markets and the various farm shops that are in our area.

One of the things that have come out of the talks, which we have had recently between the valley parishes is the need, not only to work more closely together, but to look at the format and timing of our services. For an experimental period of 6 months we are changing the pattern of our services on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of the month. For this trial period Martinstown will have a **Parish Eucharist at 9.30am** and Winterbourne Abbas a **Come and Praise Service at 11am**; this will start on the **21<sup>st</sup> October** with a **Harvest Come and Praise**, do join us.

Over the past few months a lot of new people have moved into our villages, and we welcome you. I would draw your attention to some of the things mentioned under **Church News**. – Our **Teddy Praise** service for the under 5's; **Bellringing**; **Choir & Music group**; not to mention our monthly **Valley View Lunch Club** which meets up at the Farm Shop – you are all welcome.

As you will see this year is the bi-annual Celebration of Wholeness & Healing in the Cathedral in October. We are also introducing a new **Healing Service** at Winterbourne Steepleton on **Sunday 21<sup>st</sup> October at 6pm**. This is for anyone who would like to receive prayer for healing for themselves or for someone else. The following **Sunday 28<sup>th</sup> October** there will be a **Taize** service at Steepleton at 6pm. A meditative service for those who would like some space apart. I hope that through this variety of services you will all find some opportunity to meet with God.

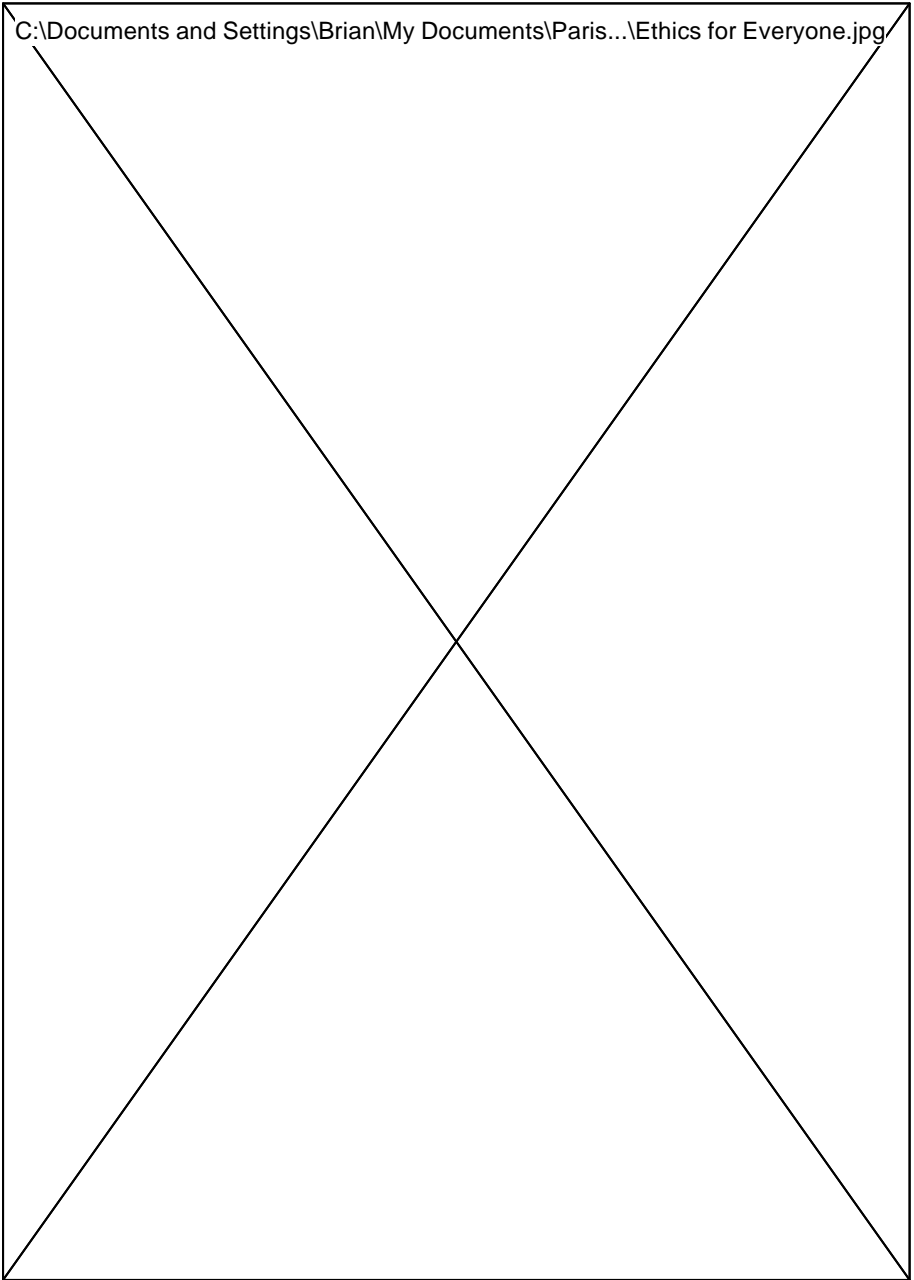
## **DUSTBIN COLLECTION**
